



Your destination is the royal city of Burgos, home of the legendary hero El Cid Campeador, as you make your way from the famous Rioja vineyards to the immense Castilian tableland at the heart of the Iberian Peninsula. You'll pass through cities that have witnessed epic battles and villages where time seems to stand still. Romanesque churches, Gothic cathedrals and medieval castles ... Castile is a land of rugged beauty, rich in history and startling contrasts.

Day 1 Origin: Logroño

Arrive in Logroño on your own. This evening take a stroll through the city center and sample the varieties of wine and tapas on offer in Logroño's popular *Calle Laurel*.

- Overnight in Logroño

Day 2 Logroño – Nájera (29 kms)

Breakfast. Leave Logroño at your own pace this morning and make your way to the royal city of Nájera. Once there, don't miss the opportunity to visit the monastery to visit the spectacular Royal St. Mary's Monastery, home to an outstanding Gothic cloister and a royal pantheon where a number of Navarrese kings and queens are buried.

- Overnight in Nájera

Day 3 Nájera – Santo Domingo de La Calzada (21 kms)

Breakfast. Your destination today is Santo Domingo de la Calzada, one of the most emblematic villages on the route where, according to legend, the resuscitation of a roasted cock and hen served as a harbinger of an even greater miracle: the resurrection of a pilgrim unjustly hanged for theft, through the intercession of the saint for whom the village is named. Visit the cathedral where a live rooster and hen keep watch from their pen overlooking the main altar in commemoration of the miracle and sample some of the region's fine wine's in the nearby parador hotel across the street, once a pilgrim's hospital run by the Franciscan friars.

- Overnight in Santo Domingo de la Calzada



Day 4 Santo Domingo de la Calzada – Belorado (23 kms)

Breakfast. This morning bid farewell to the Rioja region this morning as you make your way to the region of Castile, the medieval kingdom that led the re-conquest of the Iberian peninsula from the Moors, gave birth to modern Spain and gave the world Castilian Spanish, the language spoken by hundreds of millions of people the world over.

- Overnight in Belorado

Day 5 Belorado – San Juan de Ortega (24 kms)

Breakfast. Today you'll cross the Montes de Oca (Goose Mountains), where many pilgrims in the Middle Ages became lost as they made their way through the dense pine forests. To assist them, a 12th century monk named St. John of Ortega built a monastery in the midst of this desolate area. Visit the saint's tomb in the monastery church and admire the lovely Romanesque capital depicting the Annunciation. Each spring a ray of sunlight enters through one of the church's windows on the Feast of the Annunciation, illuminating the figures of the Virgin and St. Gabriel.

- Overnight in San Juan de Ortega

Day 6 San Juan de Ortega – Burgos (27 kms)

Breakfast. Burgos is home to one of the most magnificent examples of Gothic church architecture in all of Spain and the final resting place of Spain's great epic hero, El Cid, whose remains lie buried beneath the paving of its famous cathedral. Visit the nearby convent of Las Huelgas, founded in 1187 by Eleanor of Aquitaine, daughter of Henry II of England and wife of Alfonso VIII of Castile, for the daughters of European nobility and once one of the most powerful convents in Europe.

- Overnight in Burgos

Day 7 Burgos – return home

Breakfast. Depart Burgos for return home or link to Stage 3 and continue.

- The breakfasts included in the price of accommodation are generally simple breakfasts of coffee, tea or hot chocolate; pastries, toast, marmalade, juice, etc.
- Where contracted, dinners are set-price menus that include an appetizer, a meat or fish entree, dessert, bread, water or wine. After dinner coffee and drinks are not included. Dinners are reserved and served in the restaurants of the contracted hotels wherever possible. In some cases it may be necessary to reserve dinner in nearby restaurants.
- Where contracted, the luggage transport service gives each individual traveler the right to the transport of **one (1)** piece of luggage or no more that **12 kilos (26.5 lbs)**.
